Pictured on the cover is the Monticello III Horse Drawn Canal Boat Ride, which operates on weekends from Memorial Day through mid October. The first canal boat arrived in Caldersburg (now Roscoe Village) in August of 1830. Canal Boat tours began with the Monticello II in 1971 and have continued ever since, taking guests on a ride to the past down the one mile restored stretch of the Ohio and Erie Canal.

THE HISTORY BEHIND WHITEWOMAN STREET -

Mary Harris is the earliest identifiable resident of the Coshocton area. In 1704, at the age of nine, she was taken captive by Mohawks in Massachusetts, was adopted and became a Mohawk, married, and had a family. On January 15, 1751, British colonial explorer Christopher Gist visited her town and spoke to her, recording the meeting in his journal. He named the Walhonding river "White Woman's Creek" after Mary, and it was included on English maps. She was world-famous as "The White Woman" living in the wilderness.



Coshocton In Bloom

There are flowers everywhere! It's often the first thing people notice when visiting Coshocton during the warmer months as pots, flower beds and hanging baskets explode with color. All are created and maintained by Coshocton in Bloom. The non-profit organization was created in 2009 and started with 32 hanging baskets; today the group plants more than 500! Coshocton in Bloom has helped make Coshocton a welcoming and vibrant place to live, work, and play by creating clean environments, celebrating heritage, and planting pride through volunteerism.

Since its inception, Coshocton in Bloom has won multiple national awards including several for outstanding floral displays. In 2022, the organization built two new greenhouses within the community to accommodate floral production. Most of the plants seen throughout the community are grown right here.

Coshocton In Bloom is affiliated with America in Bloom, whose mission is to promote nationwide beautification through education and community involvement by encouraging the use of flowers, plants, trees, and other environmental and lifestyle enhancements. Participating has improved the overall quality of life through its programs, grant opportunities, resources library and yearly advisor visits to Coshocton.

America in Bloom Executive Director Laura Kunkle said, "America in Bloom is helping communities of all sizes achieve their potential. Every year our participants raise the bar, and the accomplishments and progress shown by this year's group is remarkable. Where History Comes to Life!

Plan to spend the day in Historic Roscoe Village! The self-guided Living History tour brings past to present with life-size digital kiosks. The workplaces and stories of 19th century tradespeople like printing press operators, broom squires, weavers, doctors and teachers are included. Tours are available every day from 10 AM - 4PM and begin at the Roscoe Village Visitor Center. Be sure to include a visit to the nationally-accredited Johnson Humrickhouse Museum or take a ride on the Monticello III Horse Drawn Canal Boat to make the day complete.

Roscoe Village is also filled with family owned shops, lively pubs and restaurants. Browse shops that include a working leather shop, a specialty bakery just for dogs, fine jewelry, ladies clothing, made-in-Ohio food and wines, home decor, art galleries and shops filled with locally produced items. Most shops are open daily until 5 PM, with restaurants open well into the evening. See a complete list of The Shops of Roscoe Village on page 9.

Roscoe Village's annual traditions span more than 50 years and include the Apple Butter Stirrin' Festival each October, when the sounds and scents of Autumn are celebrated with Apple Butter cooking over an open fire, live music, kids' activities, artist booths, food vendors, and special Spirit Tours.

Families have made the Christmas Candlelighting Ceremonies an annual tradition for generations. Held the first two Saturdays in December, days are filled with holiday shopping, kids activities, pictures with Santa, Roscoe Holiday Tours, carolers and other surprises. When the sun goes down, luminaries line the street and candles alight in shop windows. Join with others around the base of the giant Christmas tree and be part of a special ceremony where memories are shared, stories are told, choirs sing and the light is passed from candle to candle through the crowd as Silent Night is sung. It's a wonderful way to usher in the holiday season.

Come and experience all that Historic Roscoe Village has to offer year round!







Support Local

Stroll the brick sidewalks of Historic Roscoe Village and find more than a dozen charming shops, all locally-owned and filled with unique items, many made in Ohio. From handmade leather goods, wrought iron, locally made American flags, old fashioned candy, clothing, fine jewelry, home decor, Vera Bradley and organic treats for your furry friends, there's something for everyone!

Coshocton's Downtown Historic District is also worthy of exploration. Centered around the Coshocton County Courthouse (c. 1875), shops include a nationally recognized quilt store, an antique mall, and several boutiques filled with clothing, art and collectibles. Many shops are woman and veteran owned and are located in historic buildings, featuring original flooring and tin ceilings.

Take a short drive into the county to find delightful garden centers and farm markets, a cheese house and one of Ohio's largest prom and bridal stores. Nestled throughout all areas are restaurants, coffee shops, ice cream shops, and wineries, so it's easy to make Coshocton the perfect destination for a girls weekend getaway or holiday adventure. 
